

This online programme has been developed for SET members who want to develop mentoring skills and knowledge and also offers an optional module for QTLS supporters. We are also developing a structured mentoring service. These will be complemented by our faceto-face network meetings and online forums.

From 3 April 2017, members can access the world-leading <u>EBSCO</u> research journal collection, comprising articles from more than 1,300 education journals, 530 e-books and monographs and 2,300 education-related conference papers.
