SET recently hosted two webinars from the Behavioural Insights Team (BIT) looking at how small changes can have a big effect on outcomes for learners, and how you can apply these approaches in your own settings. It was great to see so many of our members attending these webinars.

The webinars looked at a range of approaches, including how short and personalised text messages sent to learners can help improve pass rates by 12 per cent, and how an online writing assignment helped increase attendance rates by nearly 10 per cent.
