

Chair of the Practitioner Advisory Group (PAG)

Purpose of the Role

The Chair of the Practitioner Advisory Group (PAG) provides non-executive leadership to ensure the group effectively fulfils its role in advising, informing, and supporting the ETF. The Chair ensures the group operates with integrity, inclusivity, and impact, and acts as a key conduit between the practitioner community and the ETF.

Key Responsibilities

- Provide clear leadership to the PAG, ensuring it operates effectively and in line with its terms of reference.
- Chair meetings of the PAG, ensuring agendas are relevant, discussions are inclusive and focused, and actions are followed up.
- Foster a collaborative and open culture that encourages diverse practitioner voices and constructive challenge.
- Ensure the PAG provides high-quality, practitioner-informed advice to the ETF's Board and Executive Team
- Work with the organisation to ensure the PAG's input is aligned with strategic priorities and adds value to decision-making.
- Support the induction and development of PAG members.
- Ensure effective communication and feedback loops between the PAG and the wider practitioner community.
- Support succession planning and the recruitment of new PAG members.
- Embodies the ETF values

- The opportunity to lead the Practitioner Advisory Group, advising on and supporting ETF activities
- Leading the PAG at a time of great opportunity and transformational change.
- We may also call upon you to share the 'voice of the sector' with the media, if required.

Application process

To apply, members should make an expression of interest outlining their relevant experience and a paragraph on why they would like to take on the role of Chair.

We welcome applications from current members. If you are not already a member of PAG, you will also need to complete a PAG application to be able to be considered for the Chair.

Anyone who applies to be the Chair of PAG must have previous experience in a Chair role

Applications will be reviewed by ETF and their decision is final.

ETF reserve the right to take a decision based on any of the following:

- The individual's application,
- An informal discussion held with the applicant,
- Input from current PAG members, if required.

Following a short onboarding process, the PAG Chair will assume the role for the next PAG meeting which will take place on 14 November 2025. The typical term for the Chair is two years. This term will be reviewed in line with the holders PAG term.
